Curriculum News

Decodable Readers

You may have noticed your child has brought home books to read for daily practice that don't have the 'traditional' level number attached to them. While we still encourage students to borrow books that interest them and increase their vocabulary, these books will need to be read by or in conjunction with an adult until students have mastered the alphabetic code that enables them to 'read' text. Students still learning and mastering the alphabetic code will be bringing home decodable readers to practice the phonics knowledge they have been taught at school. As they are exposed to more of the alphabetic code, they will be able to decode more complex books. Providing children with opportunities to read successfully and relatively independently as soon as they can is highly motivating for beginning readers. The video link below discusses the difficulties students face when attempting to read levelled texts that contain phonic knowledge they have yet to be exposed to.

Speech and language pathologist Alison Clarke has created a video explanation of the problems with repetitive text and how they compare to decodable texts



'If levelled books are given to beginning readers in the partial alphabetic stage, they tend to guess words rather than decode them. Beginning readers need to practise their reading using the lettersound correspondences they have been taught. Levelled books are not designed to practice decoding skills.' Department for Education SA

Students will also be asked to regularly practice high frequency and 'red' words. These are words that make up a large percentage of words in children's books or are unable to be decoded through sounding out, such as 'the' and 'said'.

NAPLAN



Gawler Primary School is already a safe and supportive environment for children, with recently reviewed policies in place to combat bullying and antisocial behaviour and identify safe spaces for children to play and grow in. A space that we are proud of and the students really enjoy, is our Friendly School's activity area. This area is located in a space that students identified as a safe and calm place within the school. It is full of large games (giant Jenga, giant Lego and building blocks, various other giant board games as well as bean bags and books for quiet reading/sharing with a friend) that staff and students worked together to choose. Students know this is a safe space and are able to use it during recess and lunch breaks when they are having troubles in the yard, wanting to make new friends, or just want some alone or quiet time. Our PCW (Pastoral Care Worker) and ACEO (Aboriginal Community Engagement Officer) use some of their time to communicate and check in with students in this space. The games and activities in this area promote and support students to work with others as well as allowing them the opportunity to create relationships with students of all year levels.



Medication



If your child/ren needs to have medication at school it must be brought to the Front Office and discussed with Front Office staff. It is a Department for Education requirement that a Medication Agreement form is provided and must be completed by a GP or Specialist. Staff are not able to administer medication unless this form is provided to us.

Medication must be provided in original pharmacy packaging - clearly labelled. Staff are unable to cut or break medication.

Asthma Care Plans must be provided for a child to receive Ventolin.


