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Leadership News

Princes Park Community Recreation Hub

A cross section of our students from R-6 worked with council planners earlier this year to vote on proposed redevelopment plans for the area directly adjacent our school crossing. You may have seen the proposed plans out in the community as residents of the Town of Gawler were also involved in the consultation process. It is believed that work on a new basketball court, barbeques, seating and landscaping will begin sometime in term 3. This may mean the closure of the entrance to the Rec Centre car park near the crossing during construction. We will keep you up to date when we get more information.

North playground upgrade

As the Department for Education changed facilities managers from Spotless to Ventia late last year our North Yard playground redevelopment was delayed. The fundraising committee with the support of families and students have invested a great deal of time and effort into raising money for this upgrade (eg. money raised from the Colour Run in 2021). You will be happy to know that the playground has now gone to tender and we hope to choose a suitable company to undertake the

work shortly. Assuming all goes to plan we will be pushing for work to go ahead as quickly as possible. Stay tuned for more information!

Staff are currently undertaking some Action Research around reading strategies in their classroom. Our two year 3/4 teachers have also been working with the Gawler Curriculum Lead to unpack the new Department units of work.

COVID has hampered our school community long enough, let's finally start getting back together. See you there!




NAIDOC Week

Breakfast Club


Breakfast Club is back!




