Gawler Primary School caters for students from R-6. At the time of this report, the enrolment in 2024 is 186. Gawler Primary School is classified as Category 3 on the Department for Education Index of Educational Disadvantage. At the time of this report, the school population includes 9% Aboriginal students, 16% students with disabilities, 2% children/young people in care. # **Governing Council Report**

Our AGM was held on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> February followed by our first Governing Council meeting for 2024. Ordinary meetings were held twice a term on a Monday afternoon in weeks 4 and 8, with an alternating 3:45pm and then 5:00pm start to accommodate working members of the Governing Council.

Some of the 2024 highlights include: Stephanie Docherty, Kayla Clausen and Amanda Fountain being made .6 permanent, ensuring continuity of staff across the site for years to come, well supported Fundraising efforts across the year, a 'can' drive to support Gawler Riverside Salvation Army (we aimed to collect 200 cans but donations blew out to an amazing 680!!!). I think one of the biggest highlights was hosting a Regional National Lego League competition at our site. Coupled with this, one of our Lego League Teams (Code Blue 1) won the competition and this guaranteed them a place in the National competition in Sydney. Four staff and seven students travelled to Sydney to participate against 43 other teams. All who attended had the most fabulous time including the opportunity to visit the Sydney Opera House and the Sydney Aquarium. It would not have been possible without the incredible fundraising efforts from our school community.




# Performance Summary NAPLAN Proficiency





#### **Attendance Comment**

In South Australia, all children and young people must be in school from 6 years to 16 years old. They must attend a government or non-government school full time. From age 16 to 17 however, young people must attend school or an approved learning program (such as an apprenticeship, traineeship, accredited course or university). Schools and parents must encourage and support students to come to school every day. Parents and caregivers must make sure their child is enrolled in a school, and attends school all day and everyday it is open, unless a child is sick or has an approved exemption. Teachers and leaders actively follow up when a student misses school, including recording all absences and non-attendance. All schools in South Australia have local attendance procedures governed under the Education and Children's Services Regulations 2020.
